### ABASIAMA'S JUNE 2020 REPORT FROM CAMEROON

Cameroon mission work is increasingly difficult in the present dispensation of a pandemic world of tribulation. What makes this current tribulation more terrible for us in Cameroon is the fact that we have a double trouble of a pre-existing condition of social unrest made worse by this global outbreak of a viral plague. To preach the gospel in Cameroon is a call to endure hardship as a good soldier of Christ. The situation has been further complicated by the rainy season of flooding in my city of Limbe. The most daunting task in all of this has to do with the rescue mission work with the orphans and other vulnerable children in our care. The major focus of this particular report is the state of the orphanage and the situation of the congregation with whom I served God.

Long before the arrival of pandemic to Cameroon the children have been (and still are) traumatized by a protracted war popularly known as the Anglophone crisis. This war is still going on. Killing of men,





women and children remains unabated. This uncivilized unrest is an ideal environment for the increase in the number of orphans and homeless children. I mean very little kids like Amanda and Julie. The civil society organizations and various non-

governmental organizations simply cannot rescue all the children caught in the crossfire of this armed conflict. My



team and I have taken up the challenge of saving these kids from infant mortality. Sister Esther Ekoko and Regina Motale have been doing a great job

in serving these kids by playing the role of house parents for these kids. Sister Esther is a trained caterer while Regina is an elementary school teacher. Since schools remain closed at this time of disease, Regina who serves as a house parent also teaches the children at home. Sister Esther specializes in planning the meals, among other things she does for the children. There are two arms of the orphanage. The ones in Mile 2 and those in Mabeta, all in Limbe. My work with these children homes goes beyond mere supervision. At times I also cook for the children. Transportation to and from church. Hospitalizations and psychological support. We are overwhelmed by the amount of work we have to do every day to keep these children in good health and safety. As we continue to work together in this aspect of the gospel, it is my prayer that our collective effort will be blessed by God.

As for the congregation, we are devoted to the fellowship as we worship and study God's word together. In this present era of social distancing, we still gather to maintain the Christian fellowship that have with one another. We thank God for His Marvelous protection of all the members of our congregation that none except one member had been admitted and treated for the contagious virus. We as a church are leaning on the everlasting arms to carry the various aspects of the church work we have initiated to completion despite the setbacks of disease and civil unrest.

Our prayer and hearts' desire is that more and more people will be saved and added to our number regardless of the interruption by this global crisis.

We believe that God has the whole world in His Hand. We believe that the mission work we have been doing in Cameroon is will continue to grow to greater heights. We know that God wants us to save souls in Cameroon. Therefore, we are very grateful to everyone of you who supports this great task of preaching in Cameroon.
