News from West Africa

We have not heard from Tom and Abasiama in a while. Tom was in the US speaking on behalf of his school. Abasiama tells of other troubles. These make us realize how much easier it is to do the Work of the Gospel here than in other parts of the World. I have copied the emails I have gotten here. Please be in prayer for our missionaries in Nigeria and Cameroon.

From Tom received Oct 15, 2017

Hello brother Holloway,

Greetings to you, Donna, Mom and Dad from Jos. I am glad that I returned to Jos safely. Though the journey was a bit stormy, yet God safely brought me home. Thank you so much for your prayers. We will begin the process of Sandra and I visiting briefly

next year Lord's willing. I see the need for us to meet Ellabell family and some of our sponsors if possible to relate physically the progress of the work. May God keep you all away from bad weather. My love to everyone in the house of God. Grace and Peace,

From Abasiama in Cameroon received Oct 16, 2017

Good morning sir. It is good to write to you again. You may have wondered what went wrong again concerning our communication. The government shut down internet again after I tried to write my report that was in the process of completion. In fact this time, the government shut down telephone communication. My phone number has been blocked all these while by the same government. The political crisis even led to the banning of worship on Sunday 1st October. We were forced by the army to stay indoors on that very Sunday. Things are really getting unbearable socially in Cameroon. Facebook, Whats-app etc. have been disconnected. Due to a little international pressure, the Cameroon government has managed to open a small window of internet today but social media networks is still under lock and key. I cannot make phone call and people cannot call me because of a general call barring imposed by the government. I am suffering in Cameroon. My children are not going to school for more than a year now. I don't have any money. My condition is miserable right now. yesterday a soul was baptized after the sermon I titled "We Must Help the Weak" crafted from Acts 20:35.

From Abasiama in Cameroon Received Oct 16, 2017

Sir, it has been my wish for you to come to Cameroon to visit us. However, things are getting increasingly dangerous in the country. So, I have to suspend my calls for your visit due to security reasons. The country is obviously unsafe now for anyone. However, I am still pleading to you and my teacher Mr. Tom to permit me to visit you people there to give a live report of my work in Cameroon and to help in any way approved by you both to raise more awareness of the progress and prospects of the mission work in Cameroon. Our radio program for instance has been shut down due to the high amount of money demanded by the owners. We can have our radio station here in Cameroon if we are assisted by our friends there. We need to have a meeting face to face in order for me to explain well what needs to be done to get the job of preaching in Cameroon to a higher level of efficiency.

I have spoken with Abasiama twice since these emails. He is safe for now. His phone number keeps changing so as to get his calls through. Please remember both missionaries in your prayers. -Joe
