19th I will see the surgeon and they do an XRAY of my foot and afterward will have to do exercise every day. Hopefully healed in 3 months.



Dear Family in Christ and friends,

We pray that you had a wonderful holiday with your loved ones. Because of Covid 19 we were allowed 6 people for Xmas (Noel), and the New Year's Eve. Rose and I went to Rose Mary's for the 24th we were allowed to stay late. On the 31st the curfew was for 8:00 P.M, Rose and I stayed home. We did get into Zoom and wish Happy New Year to Church members and friends.

In regards to the church, we were not allowed to meet at all for a little while, except with (Zoom)but because the Catholics put pressure on the government and because the prime minister is a devout Catholic, they decided to let churches meet again with no more than 30, then now 70 present. For funerals and marriages no more than 30 people can gather. In the past few months, we have three families moved back to their respective countries. The first one was Wally, Rachel and their twin boys to leave for Nigeria! The other family was Ben and Rebecca Thomas, Brooklyn and Alexy. Ben was from our home congregation back in Pennsylvania, we knew from when they

first arrived that they were going to be here for a year and in half. Annie, our Malaysian sister came to Paris for her studies for 3 months, then she moved to Dijon to continue her studies. We miss all of them.

Our grandson Emmanuel moved to Caen where he was able to get a Job. We are happy because he will be with brother Steven and this way, they can encourage one another spiritually. In November Rose and I and Rose Mary's family made a three-day trip to Luxembourg to visit our old friends the Pellegrini family. The weather was extremely hot, and we had a lovely visit. Afterwards we drove back to Manu's and Rose Mary's country house where the Pellegrini's joined us and another friend's family Jean Luc, whom we hadn't seen for twenty years.

Since our granddaughters never saw me make homemade ice cream, I went ahead and made them good old home-made vanilla ice-cream; everyone enjoyed it.

Brother Danileo from Equator just arrived in Nantes, to continue his studies on engineering. He right away contacted us to find out about the church so I put him in contact with brother Samson Kasongo who lives in Nantes! Both of them follow our Bible class and worship through Zoom faithfully.

Sister Enyo from Togo, one of our former members, had to come back to France so she can renew her identity papers and her French passport, since she did not have any money to do it, we helped her. She was hoping to find a Job and work for a year and go back, but unfortunately, she was not able to find one. She decided to go back to Togo on the 16th of January.

I made a trip to Mayenne, France to visit brother Jerry Jones and his family. He is a retired preacher from the church of Christ in California. He bought a former catholic school where he and his wife plan to fix and make it a place where they can have a school teaching English and have a summer camp for the churches in Europe and bring groups from the States to help evangelize. I took him boxes of teaching materials, Bibles, and kitchen equipment. He wanted me to come visit the place and give him some advice on how to set up the kitchen and also what can he be done to improve it and would love for me to come and help teach Bible class in French and manage the kitchen during Bible camp and when groups come during summer months.

Sister Aissatou's sister who was baptized in Nigeria decided to go back to Lomé, Togo with her son Yannick. He read the material that I send him through brother Wally, and wants obey the Gospel once he is back in Togo. One more precious soul was added to the kingdom of God on Mallorca Island where brother Roberto is! Her name is Johanna a young woman that Roberto invited it to church services and Bible studies.

I did the funeral for brother Alex Fequiere! He was a brother that we first met when we arrived in Paris. He was sick for a little while, but the doctor could not find out exactly what it was. Finally, after many analyses, it turned out to be cancer. He would come to church with his family whenever he could, but on December 3rd his race with cancer ended.

After the funeral service we went to his house where Marjorie his wife had prepared food and drinks for everyone. I was able to have Bible discussions with people from six denominations, one was Rosicrucian, one was from a Bethel group, another from the Pentecostal church another one from charismatic catholic church, other from Jehovah witnesses and one from the Seven day Adventist group. The discussion went on for over an hour. It is my prayer that some of them will want to continue our Bible discussion.

The 2nd funeral on Dec. 31st was for sister Amelia Cumming, our eldest member of the church. She was baptized back in 1954 in Brussels, Belgium by brother Hilton Terry. Rose and I visited her at the hospital two weeks before her passing away. I had the privilege to baptize her son Alexander and her daughter Mireille several years ago. Since Alexander lives by himself, Rose Mary and I have been fixing meals that she takes to him. Sister Colette Daugherty has just lost her brother Remy who was 90 years old. Brother Pascal Prunier from Troyes was supposed to come and stay the weekend but was not able to make it. His Dad died.

For Sunday morning class I have been teaching "The Unfolding Truth of GOD for the World" and for Sunday evening class I have been teaching the Book of Isaiah by Zoom. Until we could meet again. We have a curfew for six pm now for 2 weeks. It may be continued if the virus infects more people.

After my visit with the foot surgeon, he schedules my surgery the fourth of January, the surgery lasts 15 minutes but I have to be off my foot for 3 weeks. A nurse comes every day to care of it. On the (**Continued on back page**)
