## ABASIAMA'S APRIL /MAY 2020 REPORT FROM CAMEROON

We give God the glory for yet another opportunity to share with you some of the important events recorded in the work of missions in Cameroon in the midst of a pandemic. Although our preaching work still accomplished some of the usual results of soul winning and congregational edification, it must be said that it was not business as usual.

For example, doing evangelism within the context of social distancing practice made our mission work a little more restricted. Proclaiming the message of salvation to a population gathered at a funeral was a little bit more cumbersome with a mask that must be frequently adjusted to prevent it from muzzling the proclaimer's mouth and message. Indeed, the pandemic impact on all aspects of our Great Commission work within the past two months was enormous.

Our coming together for worship in the months under review was equally restricted by the stringent social





distancing measures imposed by the authorities. Church life and fellowship activities in Cameroon have been never seriously affected. However, the good news is that our attendance is gradually being restored to the normal average of 70 worshipers. Our evangelism effort yielded the expected result as we witnessed the conversion of Sister Ogun



Nadesh. At the age of 29, she was baptized April and we are doing our best to help her grow in the Lord. Please join us in praying for her steady growth in the faith.

We also need your prayers to comfort our congregation in this time of our grieving over the departure of sister Elizabeth who left this world to be with the Lord in the month of March. The funeral service took place in the Cameroonian peak of the pandemic in April.

The month of May is was equally a very busy one. Occupied by the upkeep of the orphans in a period of lockdown was as challenging for me as it was for the ladies who cook for them. As schools remain closed, these children are being taught in some forms of home schooling. Sister Esther and sister Regina are doing a great job watching over these kids.

The month of May is usually a month of multiple birthday anniversaries. Myself and my daughter Nsikanima were born in May. We celebrated it in simple services of profound thanksgiving to God for his loving-kindness. We never like to close our report with a sincere recognition of

God's favor upon our ministry by means of your love and support for our work in Cameroon. We always thank God for your helping hand in all that we we have accomplished so far. We also thank for supporting the orphanage ministry that has kept some little children safe from starvation and illiteracy, while giving them a platform grow in the discipline and admonition of the Lord.
